School of Advanced Military Studies to graduate

FORT LEAVENWORTH, Kan.— The School of Advanced Military Studies (SAMS) will graduate 30 students, including two international students, attending the Advanced Military Studies Program Dec. 6 at 9 a.m. at the Eisenhower Auditorium of the Lewis and Clark Center.

Guest speaker is Lt. Gen. David R. Hogg, Commanding General, U.S. military representative on the NATO Military Committee in Belgium. Hogg is also a graduate of SAMS.

SAMS educates the future leaders of our armed forces, our allies and members of other governmental agencies at the graduate level. They are trained to be agile and adaptive leaders who solve complex problems and think critically at the strategic and operational levels.

The AMSP is a one-year, graduate-level program of the School of Advanced Military Studies that provides education in military art and science. The focus of SAMS is on the military art and science of planning, preparing for and executing full-spectrum operations in “whole of government” contexts.
