SUBJECT: Garrison Command Policy Letter #13, Running Routes on Fort Leavenworth

1. REFERENCES.

2. PURPOSE. To identify authorized running routes and restrictions on Fort Leavenworth.

3. GENERAL.

- a. Organized Unit Physical Readiness Training.

(1) A military formation shall march or run on the right-hand side of all roads, no more than four columns wide. All personnel must remain on the right side of the center line.

(2) Unless approved by the Garrison Commander for special events, no formation shall march or run on Main Post, in the housing areas, in the school district, on the golf course, or within the National Cemetery. See attached map for authorized Unit/Formation running routes. If approved for special events, there will be NO cadence calling while in or near housing areas. Leaders may call a quiet, no-response cadence to keep the formation in step.

(3) All large formations (10 or more) will have at least two road guards at the front and two road guards at the rear equipped with reflective vests and flashlights.

All other personnel in the formation, including the NCOIC/OIC are required to wear reflective belts. Formations will have adequate emergency communications and maintain straggler control to ensure all stragglers move off to the right side of the roadway.

(4) Use of the perimeter roads of the United States Disciplinary Barracks (USDB) and the Joint Regional Corrections Facility (JRCF) is unauthorized.

b. Individual Physical Fitness Training when Outdoors.

(1) Individual runners/walkers, Military and Civilian, must run on sidewalks when available. If no sidewalk exists, the road shoulder may be used. Running/walking in the street will be the last resort. When running on the shoulder or street, runners will exercise extreme caution and run facing traffic in a single file. Running is prohibited on Grant Avenue, Hancock Avenue through the National Cemetery and on the Fort Leavenworth Golf Course cart path.

(2) Headphones may be used while in civilian clothes and only while running, walking, and biking on the sidewalks and authorized running/biking trails.

(3) All runners in civilian attire will wear presentable clothing, i.e. running gear, running shorts, t-shirt, etc. Clothing must provide appropriate coverage during the full range of motion. Clothing may not have profanity, sexist, racist, vulgar or suggestive language or symbols. Undergarments will be worn in addition to shirts, shorts, pants, etc. Clothing will not be see-through when wet. Individuals are prohibited from wearing clothing that exposes the midriff. Running without a shirt on Fort Leavenworth is unauthorized.

(4) Runners in civilian attire should wear reflective material during early morning, evening, night hours, and periods of low visibility. Runners wearing the IPFU/APFU are required to wear the reflective belt.

(5) Use of the perimeter roads of the United States Disciplinary Barracks (USDB) and the Joint Regional Corrections Facility (JRCF) is unauthorized.


c. The IPFU is authorized for wear in the Fort Leavenworth Shoppette for quick shopping errands but must be clean and serviceable (i.e., not excessively sweaty or dirty with no rips or stains). The IPFU is not authorized for wear in the Fort Leavenworth Post Exchange to include the food court and mall vendors. The IPFU is not authorized for wear in the Fort Leavenworth Commissary except from 0730-0815, Monday through Friday, for quick shopping errands. The IPFU is not a duty uniform unless directed by the unit commander.
